## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We have reduced the number of Conferences from two a year to one, which took place in October 2019 in London. The Conference was well attended with an excellent talk from Damon Thibodeaux, a death row exoneree who spent fifteen years in Louisiana as an innocent man. In the afternoon we heard from Claire Jenkins, co-chair of British legal charity Amicus, and from Daniella, a recent Amicus volunteer who had spent time on placement in Louisiana.

The Corona virus pandemic and national UK lockdown from March 2020 disrupted some LifeLines activity. The spring edition of The Wing of Friendship was sent out electronically for the first time, although it will return to a print version as soon as possible so that the death row prisoners who LifeLines members write to can receive copies again.

Prior to the lockdown, Regional groups had a good turnout and some Regional groups have continued to meet virtually.

Membership remains at over 1,000 with only a short "waiting list" of prisoners waiting to pair with writers.

Our members-only LifeLines community on Facebook has expanded and was being used by 274 members as of 30th June 2020.

We have continued to narrow the gap between income and expenditure through careful attention to costs, and this year there was a small surplus of income over expenditure. Significant cost savings arose through the change to one Conference per year. We also re-tendered for the printing of The Wing of Friendship, which will result in further savings in the next financial year.
